Investment Objectives	The Fund aims to maximize returns from a combination of capital appreciation and income generation by investing in a diversified portfolio of fixed income securities issued by governments, agencies, supra-nationals and corporate issuers in the Asia-Pacific region.
Investment Policy	<p>The Fund may invest in the following USD-denominated securities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Issues of the Philippine government or Philippine government-owned or controlled corporations; ▪ Issues of Philippine private corporations with credit rating of at least equal to the credit rating of the Philippine government; ▪ Issues of foreign governments provided they have a minimum credit rating of BB+ (S&P) or Ba1 (Moody's); or one notch above the credit rating of the Philippine government, whichever is higher; ▪ Issues of foreign corporations provided they have a minimum credit rating of BBB (S&P) or Baa2 (Moody's); or two notches above the credit rating of the Philippine government, whichever is higher. <p>For efficient portfolio management, the Fund may acquire financial futures contracts and forward currency contracts for hedging purposes and may invest on other investments to the extent permitted by the relevant laws and regulations.</p>

<p>Risk Profile</p>	<p>Conservative to Moderate</p> <p>US Asia-Pacific Bond Fund provides the opportunity for some capital preservation and medium volatility through investments in fixed-income instruments issued by governments, agencies, supra-nationals and corporate issuers in the Asia-Pacific region. This fund is suited for investors with a conservative to moderate risk personality - those who can forgo significant upside potential to minimize losses – but can tolerate foreign currency and country risk. Investors in this fund prefer investments that are expected to grow at a slower rate over the long term coupled with minimal fluctuations.</p>
<p>Calculation of Net Asset Value and Unit Prices</p>	<p>The Company will determine the net asset value of each Fund by using market prices of the underlying funds or the quoted prices of direct investments, allowing for fund fee, any fund administration charge, purchase and sell expense, tax or other statutory levy, deposit and withdrawal made since last Valuation Date. The Unit Price of each Fund will be determined by dividing its net asset value by the corresponding number of outstanding units.</p>
<p>Fund Deductions</p>	<p>The Company shall be entitled to deduct from each Investment Fund the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) all expenses incurred by the Company directly or indirectly upon purchase and sale of investments; (ii) all expenses incurred by the Company directly or indirectly in managing, maintaining and valuing assets in such Fund; (iii) any tax or other statutory levy attributable to the investment income, and capital gain on assets of the Fund; (iv) management fee, subject to the Company’s sole discretion to change the said percentage by giving the Owner at least three months written notice; (v) all other additional charges as determined by the Company subject to approval of the Insurance Commission.

<p>Investment Accounts</p>	<p>The balance of an Investment Account at any time is the total value of Units of that Fund in that account at the Unit Price, after adjusting for the following transactions net of fees at the Next Valuation Date:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) increased by the amount of premiums allocated and applied to that Investment Account; (ii) increased by any amount transferred from another Investment Account to that Investment Account; (iii) decreased by any amount transferred to another Investment Account from that Investment Account; (iv) decreased by amounts withdrawn from that Investment Account (v) decreased by the amount of any Monthly Deduction and any other charges made by the Company from that Investment Account; and (vi) increased or decreased by the increase or decrease in the Unit Price of the relevant Fund in that Investment Account.
<p>Exceptional Circumstances</p>	<p>Where for any purposes other than the payment of the death benefit under the Policy, the realization of Units in any Investment Account(s) becomes necessary, then in such an event, if the Company in its absolute discretion considers the circumstances to be prejudicial to the interests of its policyholders, the realization of Units in the Investment Account(s) shall be deferred for a period not exceeding six months from the date the realization would in normal circumstances have taken place.</p> <p>Exceptional circumstances shall include but not be limited to the closure or suspension of dealings on recognized stock exchanges, suspension of valuation or dealings of the underlying funds, or during any period when assets in an Investment Fund cannot be valued or invested in accordance with its investment objective.</p>

<p>Definition of Terms Used</p>	<p>“Fund” or “Investment Fund” refers to any of the separate funds established by the Company through which the Owner’s Basic Premium and Top-Up Premium, if any, are invested.</p> <p>“Next Valuation Date” is the Valuation Date immediately following the date of any given transaction. Such transaction should occur before the set cut-off schedule.</p> <p>“Unit” is the unit of ownership in the Account.</p> <p>“Unit Price” is the value of a Fund. This is the basis of purchasing Units to the Fund as well as in liquidating Units from that Fund.</p> <p>“Valuation Date” is the date that the Company calculates the Unit Price of the relevant Funds applicable to this Policy.</p>
